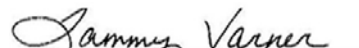

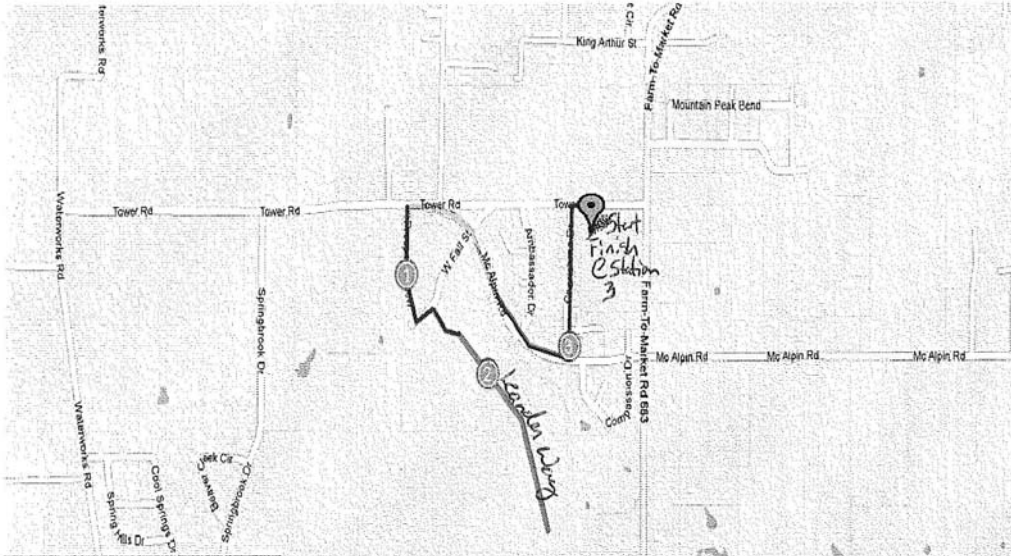

**AGENDA CAPTION:**

Consider and act upon the remounting and refurbishing of Frazer, Inc. Type I ambulance through H-GAC for \$92,250.00.

**ITEM SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:**

For the last twelve (12) years we have purchased new Frazer Type I ambulances for our fleet. We have increased our fleet to four (4) ambulances to provide a first out Medic at each fire station with a fourth ambulance in reserve. Each new unit remains in front-line service for six (6) years and then rotates to the reserve position for two (2) years. Historically, the heavy wear and tear on our ambulances from long runs over City and County roads has made replacement necessary at the eight (8) year point in order to ensure response reliability. In the past, we have traded-in or auctioned the old ambulances. We have the option to refurbish and remount the patient compartment of our oldest ambulance onto a new Dodge diesel chassis at a substantial savings (\$26,450) over the purchase of a totally new unit.

**SPECIAL CONSIDERATION:**

For a limited time, Frazer can supply a 2009 or 2010 Dodge diesel chassis. Because of increasing emissions standards, the 2011 diesel chassis will cost approximately \$5,000 - \$7,000 more and require the addition of a urea tank with its added maintenance expense. The 2009 chassis is priced \$2,000 less than the 2010 chassis. The timing of this purchase also allows us to continue with our long-standing ambulance rotation program.

**FINANCIAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:**

Funding for this chassis purchase and remount will come from Fund 404 (Capital Reserve Fund) which was funded via monies that were budgeted and set aside in previous fiscal years for apparatus replacement.
